#### **Amazing Shake**

This week, we completed our first 3 rounds of the 'Amazing Shake' competition.

Students did an outstanding job as part of this student leadership and development competition. 'The Amazing Shake' is a 'soft-skills' competition that encourages students to show off basic but highly important skills like using eye contact when speaking, having a good handshake, being able to carry on a conversation (not preteen grunts), good body language and a neat and tidy appearance. If you think of how you would appear and act at a job interview, you have a good idea of what we hope our students to

get out of the competition. Students have learnt many of these skills in leadership sessions earlier in the year and on camp.

Our first round was held at school with all Year 6 students competing in 'The Gauntlet', a round of 10 impromptu scenarios where students were asked to speak and act for one minute per scenario. 3 of these were prepared but 7 of them were unknown to the students as they had to think on their feet. All students performed so well and achieved many personal milestones. The buzz of excitement once they finished was tangible! Students reported how fun it was and how they wanted to do it again! What was initially a daunting task, again gave our students the opportunity to shine and to continue to develop the very important interpersonal and leadership skills that will help prepare them for the future.

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From our large group of around 70 students, 20 made it to the next round 'The Circle of Doom' where students were asked to hold a conversation in turn with 23 volunteers.

Each round students are scored on a range of criteria including handshake, presentation, confidence, adaptability and even the 'je ne sais quoi/there's something about this person' quality.

From 20 we progressed to a Top 12 this year. 10 of these amazing students had the opportunity to present their allocated persuasive speeches on current council 'hot topics' such as 'should E-scooters be banned?' to the Mayor, Mrs Helen Blackburn and to Councillors Larine Statham-Blair and Gary Kirk. They did an incredible job and even had the opportunity to wear the Mayoral Chains on the day. We are still awaiting two final student presentations before we select our Top 5 and look forward to announcing them sometime next week.

The Top 5 will go on to compete in a secret challenge in Week 5.

One of the big take always from both Mr Jordan and myself was the genuine way each of our Top 12 competitors supported each other throughout this process. As you can imagine, it was a daunting experience and to see the comraderie and support for one another that our students showed was a testament to their character and the sense of community evident throughout our student leader cohort.

I would like to extend an enormous thanks to Mr Jordan and our volunteers for making this incredibly valuable opportunity possible for students. These events don't happen without significant support and someone to lead the charge.

#### **Learning Highlights:**

This week I enjoyed learning walks and talks in 2A, 2B, 5B and 5/6C. I enjoyed hearing about the different strategies 5B students were using to support their multiplication learning. They used a range of strategies and were able to demonstrate their mathematical thinking. It showed just how you can arrive at the same answer many different ways!

Well done also to 2B who were practising their place value work, writing numbers with hundreds, tens and ones!

2A was working on their fairy-tale story as part of their English unit, learning about the types of attributes characters can have in a story. They were exploring attributes, actions, qualities and thoughts as they read a traditional fairy-tale with Mrs T this week. They will use these to support their own writing as they progress through their unit of work.

When I visited 5/6C, Yr 6 students were rehearsing their speeches for The Amazing Shake with their relief teacher, Mr Dingley. It was fantastic to see students supporting each other and to hear the wonderful prepared speeches written by our students! Well done 5/6C!

A letter went home with football students today to go over all the changes so please check your child's bag for more information.




#### **PBL Reward System Change**

From next week, we will be transitioning to ONLINE reward tracking system through Class Dojo. We will still use our trade in tickets and tokens. Instead of PBL reward charts, however we will be tracking reward points online. Our staff have discussed this as a great opportunity to refresh our PBL reward system and to reduce our impact on the environment through reduction in use of multiple cardboard or paper charts across the year.

The amount of acknowledgements won't change and students will still work towards their end of term reward activities and towards Bronze, Silver, Gold and Excellence charts. The only difference will be that points will be recorded via an engaging online format with each student hatching their own monster avatar (see example demo class below). We will transition from next week and updated online consent forms will be sent home for all families to add this online feature to our permissions.



The ACE program is exclusive to Kepnock State High School and provides opportunities for highly motivated students to excel in their learning. Kepnock has created a program that delivers focused assessment and learning experiences that support the unique learning needs of talented students. Teachers who have proven success in supporting high achieving students, facilitate the programs in English, Mathematics, Humanities and Science.

Kepnock High believes that students who are focused on academic success have needs that are just as significant as any other learning group. By fostering the talents of these learners and all of our students, we create our community's next leaders and entrepreneurs.

While focusing on challenging students in the core learning areas of English, Mathematics, Humanities and Science, ACE students also study all other Key Learning Areas (KLAs) offered at the school including Languages (German or Japanese), HPE, The Arts and Technologies.

Kepnock's ACE Program operates in close partnership with the Coral Coast Cluster primary feeder schools to identify and support the learning needs of high achieving students in reaching their considerable potential.

#### **Expectations for ACE**

Students accepted into the ACE program are expected to continually meet high standards for academic achievement, behaviour and effort. There are regular student review points across Years 7 and 8 where every ACE student's continued participation in the program is evaluated. If students are not meeting the expectations of the program, they may be asked to relinquish their position to higher performing students in non-ACE classes.

Entry into the ACE program is selective. Students wanting to apply for a place in the 2024 ACE Program need to complete an online application and submit it by 4pm Friday 14 June 2024. ### **Bursary Applications**

Year 6 students who have demonstrated talents in **academic**, **cultural** or **sporting** pursuits are invited to apply for one of four bursaries sponsored by the Kepnock P&C Association. Successful applicants receive financial support for Years 7 and 8 (conditions apply).

Bursary winners will demonstrate exceptional ability in one of the following three categories:

**Sporting** - Demonstrated high standards in School sports, team sports, athletics, swimming, club or individual pursuits

**Academic** - Achieved excellent grades across all subject areas as well as high results in external competitions (e.g. Mathematics, Science and English)

Students are required to submit an application that highlights their talents in one or more of the above fields. All applications are reviewed and shortlisted for a final decision. It is an expectation that all bursary winners will maintain consistently high levels of achievement in their academic and extra-curricular pursuits. They will also be expected to demonstrate the school values to a high standard at all times.

Students wanting to apply for a Bursary need to complete an online application and submit it by 4 pm Friday 16 June 2023.

# **Sports Development Program**

The Sports Development Program (SDP) is a challenge HPE program that exposes students to fitness programs, nutrition, coaching techniques, sports science, sports psychology and a range of sporting skills. Sports may include, but are not restricted to swimming, athletics, basketball, touch and soccer. Students are challenged through various experiences in these sports and other activities in pursuit of sporting excellence in a supportive environment.

# **Expectations for SDP**

Students accepted into the Sports Development Program are expected to participate in all school sporting carnivals (swimming, cross country, athletics) and represent Kepnock State High School if selected to be a member of the school swimming, athletics or cross-country team. Students will also represent the school in both the winter and summer sports on offer. Students are to maintain high standards for academic achievement, behaviour and effort. There are regular student review points across Years 7 and 8 where every SDP student's continued participation in the program is evaluated. If students are not meeting the expectations of the program they may be asked to relinquish their position to higher performing students in non-SDP classes.

Entry into the SDP program is selective. There is only one class (max. 28 students). Students wanting to apply for a place in the Sports Development Program need to complete an application process. For further information on the SDP,
