Student Learning Highlight: 2B and 3B

As we come to the end of another busy term, students and teachers are busy finishing their assessment tasks. Students are receiving feedback on draft assessments and are working on presentations and written pieces of work that showcase what they have learnt this term.

Every week, one of the most important parts of my job, and a part I absolutely love, is talking with students about their learning. Sometimes I visit in classrooms to do a learning walk and talk, sometimes students pop in to show me their great work and sometimes we are chatting around the school as we cross paths. Our students and teachers work so hard across the term and it is my pleasure to highlight and share some of these examples each week.

One of my visitors this week was Tazzmen in 2B. He has been working very hard with our Student Engagement Teacher, Mrs Renae McKay on his English assessment task to create, rehearse and present a multimodal procedure. Students chose ideas from Roald Dahl's book *George's Marvellous Medicine* to create a procedure for George to make a sandwich for his grandma. Their task is to plan and draft the procedure, edit the procedure using a checklist, publish the procedure, rehearse the procedure with a partner and present the procedure to an audience of peers. Tazz has worked so hard this term and was so excited to come and show me his procedure that he has written, composed using images, props and a presentation that he has recorded on our class iPads to support his planned presentation to his class next week. Tazz has done an amazing job of this task and I'm not sure I could be more excited than he was to share and showcase his work! Well done Tazz! Keep up the amazing work and good luck with your presentation next week!

A note about the use of iPads to support learning: As part of the Australian Curriculum, students are often required to complete multimodal tasks where they may use a range of materials and approaches to engage in learning. One of our support tools in this space are our iPads. In this example, someone who might have initially found it overwhelming to present a written assessment task to a whole class (and let's face it, I am sure many adults would struggle too), has been able to use the iPad as a tool to engage and scaffold his learning. It has enabled Tazz to complete his work to an extremely high standard and engage in his learning with confidence and success. You can see him presenting his task on the image on the iPad in the picture above. This is how our technology can effectively support student learning and I only wish you could have watched his incredible presentation with me to see the difference these tools can make when used this way! We are again grateful to our P&C team who supported the school by funding an extra set of class iPads that are being used this way every day.



Another student doing great work who I spoke with this week was Flynn C in 3B. He spoke very passionately about his current English task in Year 3 where students are writing about overcoming a fear. Throughout our curriculum, teaching and learning work, our students work with our teachers on what we call the 'success criteria'. This means unpacking and learning about what is required to achieve an A, B or C in their work (example for the Yr 3 success criteria for this task is below). Teachers build their learning walls with students each term and part of that is developing an understanding of the elements needed to improve and achieve their best using the criteria as a guide. It is really important that children know what they need to do to achieve their goal and I encourage you to ask your child about how they are going with their English and what they need to do to get an A, B or C. Flynn was telling me all about how he thinks he is currently achieving a B but is still aiming for that A standard. He spoke to me about the elements of his writing and language features he is using and about seeking feedback from Mr Morgan through conferencing to keep improving his work. I was impressed by his passion for learning and it was a wonderful reflection of the learning happening in our classrooms each and every day. I can't wait to see how you go this term Flynn!

After School

A important note for parents about after school routines and procedures. Unfortunately, a parent was hit by a stray ball at the main entry to the school when collecting a child this week due to students playing a ballgame in the area near the gate after school. For everyone's safety, we revised our after school rules and expectations with students this week. They include:

- All students waiting to be collected by a bus need to wait undercover in the bus shelter.
- All students waiting for a parent at the front of the school are to wait by the tree near the gate sitting down if possible.
- Children are ONLY allowed on a playground if they have a parent with them. Staff may check and ask students on the playgrounds if they are with a parent and redirect them away from the playground if they are not.
- Our Prep playground has recently sustained damage due to overuse and particularly use by children too large for that playground, so we appreciate parent support to ensure that only young children are accessing this particular playground.
- Students riding bikes or scooters are to walk their bikes or scooters out of the school grounds and should not stop by playgrounds on the way out.
- While we are happy to allow some brief play on playgrounds after school as long as you are supervising as a parent, I am seeking parent support to please make your way out of the school grounds by around the half hour mark after school finishes. This way, we can ensure children are safely off site and will allow our staff and cleaners to clean the areas and playgrounds safely also. This also means our Helping Hands service, who pay rent to access school facilities, have access to the playgrounds as agreed through our hire agreement.
- We have staff on duty until approximately 3.10/3.15 each day at the main school entrance. However, we have noticed there are increasingly some students who are being collected quite late (sometimes not until after 3.30). We understand that sometimes, being late is an unexpected thing due to something outside your control, and we are happy for you to contact the office in this instance so we can support children with office supervision.

- Alternatively, we do have Helping Hands, our outside hours school care facility on site and I encourage parents and families who cannot collect children early to contact Paige and the friendly team there to discuss the support they can provide to families in this situation. 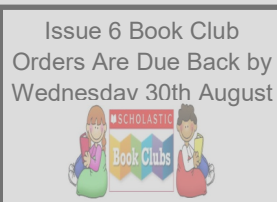

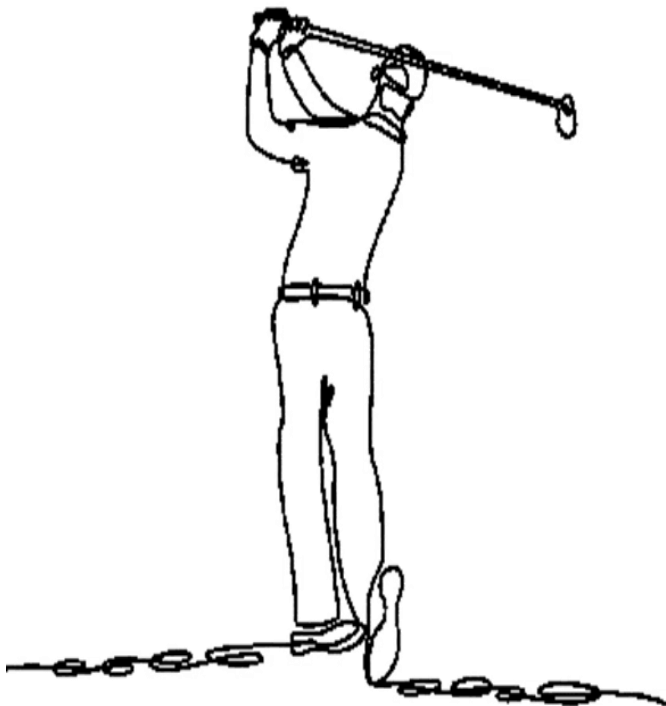

Year 6 Graduation & End of Year Events Planning

- **Yr 6 Graduation will now be an evening event from 5.30pm-7.00pm hosted at the school with a light supper provided. 

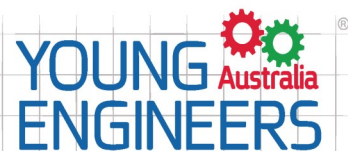
